What's a print disability?

A print disability is any condition that makes it difficult or impossible to read standard print, including:

- Visual disabilities - such as blindness or partial sight.
- Physical disabilities - which make it difficult or impossible for someone to hold a book or turn pages.
- Learning disabilities - and challenges related to comprehension of print.

Who qualifies?

If you have a public library card and you're an educator who works with students with print disabilities in a school or post-secondary institution, you qualify to access thousands of materials for your students through the CELA Educator Access Program.
